Building Awareness of the Community Emergency Hotline

The AllKids team recently held a Community Educational Workshop in Jai Chkae to raise awareness of the Ream Community Health and Medical System and its emergency hotline.

Community members learned that the hotline is available for all medical emergencies, not just child protection or domestic violence cases. The session explained how trained first responders, AllKids staff, the Ream Health Centre, referral hospitals and trusted healthcare partners work together to ensure families receive safe, appropriate medical care. Participants also learned about the risks of relying on private clinics, which can often result in poor treatment outcomes and unnecessary financial hardship.

Families were encouraged to save the emergency hotline number in their phones, and it was encouraging to see such positive engagement and appreciation from the Jai Chkae community.

Investing in Great Teachers

AllKids recently held a professional development workshop for ten teachers, led by Sophat, focusing on strengthening teaching practice and classroom engagement.

The training explored what makes an inspiring teacher, the importance of active listening, building confidence in the classroom, and understanding the purpose of learning from both the teacher's and student's perspective. Participants also reflected on teachers who had positively influenced their own lives and discussed the qualities they admired most.

To conclude the workshop, Sdoueng introduced a range of educational games and interactive teaching activities, giving teachers practical techniques they can adapt for their own classrooms to create engaging and enjoyable learning experiences for students.

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Supporting Families with Essential Hygiene Improvements

During a recent outreach visit to a family living at the landfill, the AllKids team identified extremely challenging living conditions through a basic hygiene needs assessment. The family had no rainwater collection system, washing station, toilet, or designated bathing area, making everyday life difficult and increasing health risks.

To begin addressing these urgent needs, AllKids installed a guttering system on the family's home to collect rainwater — an important first step towards improving hygiene, health and wellbeing. The family was incredibly grateful for the support.

This assistance forms part of AllKids' commitment to working alongside vulnerable families, helping them meet basic needs while creating safer and healthier home environments for children.





Preparing Young People for the Future

Twenty-five AllKids students aged 15 years and above recently participated in a full-day youth development workshop facilitated by M'lop Tapang. The training was designed to prepare students for life beyond school by developing practical skills and confidence for the future.

The workshop explored topics including honesty and integrity, preparing for the workforce, workplace ethics, personal financial management, building self-confidence, and lifelong self-improvement. Students also received practical advice on becoming outstanding employees and developing the attitudes and behaviours that employers value.

By equipping young people with these essential life and employability skills, AllKids is helping students build a strong foundation for successful and independent futures.



Environmental Awareness Workshop for Chamkapich Students

Students at the Chamkapich Centre recently took part in an environmental awareness workshop held by Six Senses Krabey Island, focused on practical ways to care for the environment and use resources responsibly. The session explored topics such as reducing water use, making thoughtful food choices, cutting down on single-use plastics, and identifying everyday habits that can have a positive impact on the community.

Rather than focusing on technology or household appliances, the workshop encouraged students to think about simple actions that can improve health, reduce waste, and protect local natural resources. The discussion was interactive, with students sharing their own experiences and ideas for reducing litter.
